Reviewed Previous Minutes

- 3 of 5 operators have provided requested signatories information
- Charter update will be issued for signatures following provision of these details
- OHSI Recommendation #7
 - OSHI Rec 8 to be reviewed to determine if it will remain aligned with proposed changes to Rec 7 (subgroup to conduct)
- HOSC representative met with Helicopter Service Provider and the Operators vending machine provider to discuss options for improvement (This discussion is specific to the card vending machines)
 - Inventory The vending machines communicate inventory levels to the vendor via an APP
 - o The thresholds for awareness and restock have been improved
 - o Reduced volumes will be identified sooner
 - o Restock will be initiated earlier than previously
 - Special dietary requirements-work is underway to create a poster which lists all
 contents of the vending machines and color codes the items to dietary requirements
 (i.e. diabetes, gluten free). Upgrade the vending machine labels so that the color codes
 are displayed by each item. All operator logistics have met, and this is currently in place.

Future Agenda items/ New Business

- Next meeting Aug 8th due to Regatta Day Aug 7th
- Mobile Phone Instructions
 - It was reported to HOSC that instructions on in cabin management of a mobile phones overheating or on fire were not provided to passengers prior to boarding the aircraft and were not in plain view for all passengers once onboard
 - HOSC followed up with the Helicopter Service Provider (Cougar) and an information poster is new displayed at the heliport and reference is also made in the pre-boarding briefing. Posters have also been provided to be displayed offshore.
- AED- Cougar Helicopters looking at possibility of having AED installed on aircrafts
- Flight Suit Heliport
 - A passenger was travelling offshore and reported that it was cool onboard the aircraft, so they attempted to don their mitts but was unable to do so due to the sizing issue (mitt (s) were too small)
 - The concern was brought forward by the Operator that there could be potentially be others unknowingly, like the passenger in question, whose mitts don't fit properly
 - Operator conducted an 8-week mitt fit check on all passengers travelling to their installation and found no other issues with mitt fit but did identify passengers requiring refits and suit modification for other items
 - Reminder to all passengers to ensure the fit of all features of their suits is correct and to also report any change in body type, specifically weight loss or gain
- Rec 7/8 Subgroup (Dan, Mike, Will and Dave)-Provide 2-week updates to group
- Cougar Safety Awareness Bulletins
 - o Increase in number and quality issued
 - o Good distribution reported
 - o Consensus that these are of good value to the workforce
